Save Money and Water

There are multiple benefits to drip irrigation, and our customers generally see a reduction in their water bill. By applying water only where and when it is needed, with less runoff, deep percolation, and evaporation from leaves and soil, the uniform application of water from drip irrigation systems can achieve high water savings. Watering only the roots of the plants also helps to cut down on weed growth. Low volume irrigation systems can be placed in difficult to water sites that are steep, oddly shaped, or in windy areas. Other than saving money, the most important aspect of drip irrigation is the ability to maintain constant soil moisture in the targeted area, making the root zone more conducive to plant growth.

Retaining Walls

We live in a beautiful area with rolling hills and steep ridges, often requiring the use of retaining walls to achieve a flat yard area.
